In times of emergencies that can affect any family today food and shelter are vital to avoiding disease and further loss of human life

Can you help?

Cold, wet & without food

- In Eastern Europe today there are terrible disasters both natural and man made that leave a trail of havoc in their wake including losses of human life.
- Families not only loose their homes in these disasters and all they own including clothing, personal items and food water supplies but are displaced too.
- Children, senior citizens and the medically unfit people are worst affected and most at risk.
- Man made and natural disasters include flooding, landslides, earthquakes and chemical accidents – all of which displace and leave families homeless and without means are a yearly occurrence in Eastern Europe today.

Water is vital to life



- Clean drinking water is vital to life of all human species including animals and plants.
- If we drink dirty water we become seriously ill and can die as a direct result.
- Animals and plants which form the food chain also become infected from high quantities of dirty water as in flooding, putting human life also at risk if consumed.

Fresh food in emergencies



- In emergencies the loss of the food chain is a problem faced by every family affected no matter what type of disaster is on hand.
- It is vital that a hot meal (soup is ideal as is quick to make in an improvised kitchen and warms the stomach) along with fresh drinks of tea and fresh fruit to help with vitamin intake to disaster survivors especially those who are of a fragile age.
- It may take several days to get the natural supplies of food into a disaster area again and in this time our NGO support is vital as we work hands on in these emergencies.

Temporary accommodation





- Emergency clean, dry and easily erected accommodation for disaster victims is as essential as is clean water and fresh food.
- Families affected by disasters of all types must have a roof over their heads until the emergency is cleared and alternative accommodation can be found or built by authorities. Tents of a thermal quality which are completely water resistant are ideal, plus clean warm bedding.
- Within the accommodation setting group we must also include emergency showers and camp style toilet facilities.

Replacement clothing and footwear

- Disaster victims all too often remain only with the clothing they stand up in and that is often wet and dirty because of the disaster.
- All other personal clothing has been destroyed in the disaster.
- We provide emergency clean and in as new condition replacement clothing and footwear, thus helping raise hygiene standards also.
- Other consumables that aid personal hygiene and avert infection and disease in times of disaster like soap, shampoo, toothbrush and toothpaste, plus ladies extra personal hygiene items we also provide.







Our emergency disaster relief work includes

- Help in rescue of persons in the emergency zone
- Collaboration with local authorities, all emergency services who are often stretched well beyond limits in times of disasters and Churches who also offer assistance.
- Setting up of portable clean, dry accommodations for families affected
- Provision of fresh drinking water.
- Provision of emergency fresh food supplies.
- Ongoing support for families affected including counselling and social support.

Your donation will help a disaster affected family directly

- 10 Euro will feed a family affected for 1 day in the disaster zone with essential fresh hot food and hot drinks plus fresh fruit to help with vital vitamin intake.
- 20 Euro will provide vital hygiene supplies to a family for a month.

- 200 Euro will provide an emergency shelter large tent accommodation for a refugee disaster family.
